**Toolangi Sculpture Trail 2016** extending on creative initiatives since 2009 through a program of art and environmental events, & the redevelopment of the sculpture trail, creating a much needed permanent space for community connection, & personal & private reflection

**Toolangi and District Community House "Community Fitness" Project** will help a very active group continue to achieve better health outcomes over the next 12 months.

**Foggy Mountain Inc. "Foggy Mountain Bluegrass Festival"** will be supported in its third year to provide engagement with schools in the Ranges through song writing workshops towards presenting a community concert during the Festival.

**Kinglake West Uniting Church "Feeding the Many Needs" Project** funding will allow the creation of an Access for All pathway and the purchase of some equipment to assist those attending the Friday night community meals and foodshare program.

Events and Equipment; support for the purchase of an earth auger and for running community events such as the combined picnic with Flowerdale CFA to promote fire preparedness in November.	
<b>Fauna and Toolangi</b>	<b>\$12,000</b>
Equipment purchase to survey fauna in backyards and to support presentation of results.	
<b>Rotary of Kinglake Ranges</b>	<b>\$5,000</b>
Backing up a previous grant to allow Rotary to purchase further Display Equipment for Kinglake Ranges Art Show.	
<b>Ellimatta Youth Inc.</b>	<b>\$40,239</b>
Support for staffing to offer a range of programs including a weekly drop in and fortnightly Friday night recreation in the "Connecting Kinglake Ranges Youth" Project.

A continuation of support for the Monthly Meetings program and to run quarterly workshops, building capacity, skills, networks and confidence in women of the Kinglake Ranges with a focus on emergency prevention/preparation and response.

### Funded Grants from 2015 - Round 3

**Upper Goulburn Landcare Network's "Stony Creek Biodiversity Project: Granted \$4,657**  
will work towards improving the degraded areas of Stony Creek involving Kinglake Landcare and Conservation Volunteers Australia. Kinglake Scouts will have an input into nest box building projects. A community nightwalk at nearby Wallaby Springs Reserve combining with neighbouring Flowerdale Landcare and National Tree Day community planting will also be part of the Project.

**Toolangi Castella Men's Shed "Tools for Toolangi Men's Shed Project: Granted \$4,000**  
will enable the Shedders to purchase much needed tools and machinery to make their Shed operational. The men and others in Toolangi and surrounds will benefit from the transfer of skills and knowledge and will be a great example "of improving community connectedness and social wellbeing".

**Rotary of Kinglake Granted \$11,400**  
will be busy with their "Kinglake Project" which will see the main street and surrounds given a makeover with the addition of hanging baskets and flower boxes adding a sense of pride and belonging to residents of the township.

**Foggy Mountain Inc. Granted \$21,450**  
Are supported with their "Foggy Mountain Bluegrass Festival" Project. This three day Festival gives an opportunity for local talent to shine. The involvement of our local children throughout the schools in the Ranges in song writing workshops culminating in their performance at a community concert is again sure to inspire.

**Kinglake Primary School Granted \$3,000**  
"Let's Get Gardening " Project will create an opportunity for the school community and other community groups to bring about a food production garden with the students. The existing memorial garden will also be re-vitalised.

**Kinglake Ranges Children's Centre Granted \$9,057**  
Will develop the green thumbs and environmental interaction of the little people with the "Let's Nurture Nature; Embedding Sustainability and Nature Play in the Early Years" Project

**Toolangi Castella District Community House Inc. Granted \$762**  
will add to their ability to offer fitness and health training with the "Purchase of exercise equipment" Project

**Kinglake West Primary School's "Bus and Bike Trailer Shelter" Project will enable assets donated by Variety and Kinglake Lions to be kept safe and secure and out of the weather for the three schools and local community groups that make use of these assets. Granted \$6,313**

**Kinglake Ranges Blue Light Vic. will continue to be a leader in youth engagement with the programs they will be able to offer young people in the district. Granted \$9,529.50**
